Bishop Douglas J. Lucia Guest Speaker 48th Annual Benefit Dinner

Bishop Douglas J. Lucia was born in March 17, 1963. He and his twin brother, their sister and their younger brother grew up in Altona, NY. He received a Bachelors of Arts from Wadham's Hall Seminary College in Ogdensburg, NY and a Masters in Divinity from Christ the King Seminary in East Aurora, NY. He was ordained to the Ministerial Priesthood at St. Mary's Cathedral in Ogdensburg, NY on May 20, 1989 by Most Reverend Stanislaus J. Brzana, DD, STD, Bishop of Ogdensburg. In his first assignment, Bishop Lucia served as parochial vicar at St. Patrick's Church in Watertown, NY. In 1990, he was sent to the Diocese of Alexandria Cornwall, Ontario, Canada for two years of service where he was parochial vicar at St. Columban's Church in Cornwall. Upon returning to the Diocese of Ogdensburg, Bishop Lucia became the parochial vicar at St. John the Baptist Church in Plattsburgh, N.Y. for three years. He was then assigned as a parochial vicar at St. Mary's Cathedral in Ogdensburg. He became the associate secretary of the Matrimonial Tribunal in 1996. From 1997 to 1999, he was assigned to study canon law at the Pontifical University at St. Thomas Aquinas (Angelicum) in Rome.

During the summer of 1998, he served as a parochial vicar of Holy Family Church in Watertown and worked part time for the Diocesan Tribunal Office. In 2000, he was appointed secretary to the bishop and in 2003 was named diocesan director of vocations. In September 2004, Bishop Robert J. Cunningham, then Bishop of Ogdensburg, appointed him as chancellor and episcopal vicar for Diocesan Services. In 2005, he was given additional responsibilities as diocesan director of seminarians. In June 2006, while retaining his diocesan responsibilities, Bishop Lucia was appointed pastor of St. John the Evangelist Church in Morristown and St. Peter's Church in Hammond with its mission of St. Patrick's Church in Rossie. In August 2008, the Bishop Lucia was appointed pastor of the Roman Catholic Church of St. Mary's in Canton where he served until June 2017. During this time period, he served as the episcopal vicar for worship as well as the adjutant judicial vicar. In 2017, he was appointed pastor of St. Mary's Church in Waddington and St. John the Baptist Church in Madrid and the judicial vicar of the diocese. He continued in his role of diocesan vocation director and director of seminarians. On June 4, 2019, Pope Francis appointed him to be the 11th bishop of the Diocese of Syracuse. As bishop of Syracuse, Bishop Lucia is the shepherd of over 220,000 Catholics who reside in seven counties of the diocese covering 5,479 square miles.



Scholarships for Years to Come

Over the fifty years of its existence, the invested assets of the Sacred Heart Foundation have continued to grow through donations large and small which have been carefully managed. Foundation assets now exceed \$4 million. The Sacred Heart Foundation Board takes its fiduciary responsibility very seriously and is very protective of these assets ensuring the Foundation can provide scholarships for years to come.

Each year the Foundation determines the amount of educational assistance to be provided by using a specific formula according to our by-laws. The formula uses a five year average of assets (to allow for market changes) multiplied by a rate of 5.8% (an average rate of return on investment) which equals the amount of money the Foundation can spend. Once this is established, the director proposes a budget of expenses, which is approved by the Board of Directors. Scholarships are the majority of this budget. The original founders of the Sacred Heart Foundation developed this formula to insure the perpetual life of the Foundation.

In 2021, the Sacred Heart Foundation has been able to award scholarships totaling \$95,000. These scholarships help to educate priests at a time when small communities are closing churches and/or offering fewer mass times. Sacred Heart Foundation 2021 Scholarships

Colombia

In addition to staffing Santa Margarita Maria Parish, which is located in a poor, working class section of Bogotá, MSC in Colombia are also involved in formation and provide direct assistance to the poor. The formation program (Casa Chevalier) is flourishing. As part of their formation, the seminarians studying at Casa Chevalier go on mission experiences to very remote areas in Colombia during their Christmas and Easter vacations. Seminarians also help manage the MSC farm, thereby helping to provide the food they eat.

The MSC have a long history of volunteering at Fundación Vida Nueva (New Life Foundation), which works with prostitutes and their children to help them break the cycle of prostitution. MSC seminarians teach catechism classes to the children there.





When the province was declared in 1986 and entirely autonomous, Father Mark Plante, a Canadian, was its first Provincial Superior.

Philippines

On December 12, 1908, eight Dutch MSC landed in Surigao. They took over from the Benedictine Fathers who were withdrawing from parish ministry. Their first letters show how impressed they were with country and people, with culture and religiosity, but also how overwhelmed by the amount of work that awaited them. But their only reaction was: we need more priests and brothers, as soon as possible. Over the years they would get them. Since 1908 they were followed by about one hundred eighty more Dutch missionaries. Progressively they were joined by more and more Filipino confreres; from the first ones in 1935 till the present time, one hundred and ten Filipino MSC priests were ordained. Filipino MSCs were sent as missionaries to Japan, the Marshall Islands, Brazil and the U.S.A. Regionally the Philippine Province has offered hospitality to MSCs from Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and the Islands of the Pacific who came for further study to the Philippines, and over the years it welcomed MSC seminarians from India, Korea and recently Vietnam.
